Many of us feed the birds in winter but in summer – especially a summer as hot and dry as this - we need to put out water for them.

Reports of **birds being found dead** with no visible cause – no marks of mauling by cat or fox – make it clear they are dying from dehydration. This is desperately sad. The more of us who can keep a bowl of water topped up in the garden or on a balcony or windowsill the better!
